WHERE ARE WE

WhizzKids United is situated at the very heart of the South African HIV epidemic – Edendale, KwaZulu Natal. Outside of the sanctuary of our WKU Health Academy, poverty, domestic violence, rape, sexual abuse, crime, substance abuse, multiple concurrent partnerships, school drop-out, high rates of teen pregnancy and unemployment form the backdrop to our work.

WHAT WE DO

WhizzKids United offers the most comprehensive approach to HIV prevention, care, treatment and support for youth in the world. WKU delivers youth focused primary health care. education and empowerment services through our very own Health Academy. The WKU Health Academy, Edendale provides youth with three monthly one-on-one counselling and risk assessments; HIV counselling & testing; ARV treatment and psychosocial support; adherence counselling; couple counselling; rape trauma support; sexual and reproductive health services including treatment and management of sexually transmitted infections and family planning. Most of all it allows vulnerable youth to meet and play in a safe and fun learning environment. Youth are greeted by health care professionals sporting football jerseys in a bright and welcoming centre fronted by a 40 x 20m Astroturf football pitch! Our adjoining Football For Hope Centre provides an array of educational and empowerment services ranging from maths lessons to pottery, science lessons to Siyakhona.

FAMILY PLANNING: Family planning services have increased from 858 visits in 2013 to 1503 visits in 2014 – as a result of increased school visits by WKU Counsellors and our WKU girls empowerment programmes.

OVC: WKU orphans and vulnerable children are supported through our tailored interventions which include home visits,

daily feeding scheme, school uniforms, support securing birth certificates and social welfare grants, educational support and health services.

AFTER SCHOOL EDUCATION: These programmes are delivered daily in the afternoons and include Homework Club, Book Club, Chess Club and Arts & Crafts Club. In 2014, 1,547 of these classes were delivered. These educational activities attract many young people between 11 and 16 years old, enabling us to teach them life skills from an early age and introduce them to clinic services including our three monthly sexual health risk assessment and HIV testing. Most of all our after school activities allow kids to have fun and learn away from the streets.

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH FOOTBALL: We have both male and female teams as well as a Mixed Gender League which helps develop young girls' and boys' self esteem, self-confidence and self-efficacy – giving them an equal voice in their communities. These leagues successfully promote three monthly health check-ups, male medial circumcision for boys and family planning for girls. Football training takes place daily at the WKU Health Academy.

SIYAKHONA: The Siyakhona programme equips youth with media skills and our youth develop their own health promotion posters, which are then displayed in schools for the benefit of all throughout our 5km target area.

GAME CHANGERS: The Game Changers programme was launched in 2014 to help unemployed youth in the community. Game Changers is a year-long programme which provides youth with personal and professional development, functional skills and a two month internship with local companies helping them prepare for employment or further education and training. In 2014, 10 youth graduated from the Game Changers programme with a 90% success rate in either finding work or going on to further study.

GHANA ANNUAL REPORT 2014

Our focus in Ghana during 2014/15 has been the construction of our WKU Academy in the Northern Region. Construction commenced in February 2014 following an initial donation from the Guerra Family and Meal a Day. The local community have been heavily involved in the building of the Academy which has kept costs down and led to a greater sense of community ownership. We are now busy with a Facebook campaign to raise the remaining £5,000 needed to complete construction.

The WKU Academy adjoins and supports the clinic built by Africaid WKU in 2002, which is managed in partnership with Planned Parenthood Association Ghana.

The outbreak of Ebola in West Africa prompted Africaid to think and act fast. In partnership with Cardiff University, Africaid ran a 'comic' design training programme with young people in Ghana focusing on how to prevent Ebola. 
